Suzanna Winton and Kay Cromartie are an acclaimed mother-daughter duo who portray features of life in the south. Human emotion, spirit, and experience is brought to life in Kay Cromartie's human life mask sculptures, and Suzanna Winton uses watercolor paints to depict tangible objects, landscapes, and portraiture.

Kay Cromartie's "inside out masks" reflect specific emotions and the collages emphasize different subjects and themes of human life, some characterizing specific times in a person's development.

Suzanna Winton, a signature member of the Florida Watercolor Society, captures the personality and history of her subjects. The energy she incorporates in her paintings brings her subjects to life.

Vocabulary


watercolor: a type of paint made from pigments suspended in water.

portrait: art showing a person or several people. For example, Suzanne Winton's *Dean* (back wall).

sculpture: art that has 3 dimensions. Stone, metal, ceramics, and wood can all be used for sculptures. Kay Cromartie uses clay to mold her life masks.

landscape: natural outdoor scenery, such as forests, mountains, and rivers.

medium: the material from which a work of art is made.
